Please turn on your outside lights!

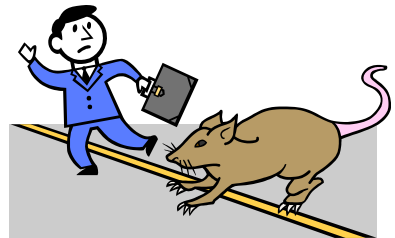
Happy Halloween
